RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **The conference schedule must be followed by everyone.**
2. Attendance at all meetings (including cabin times and morning revival) is mandatory. In case of sickness, appropriate medical attention will be obtained and parents may be asked to come take the sick child home.
3. During cabin times, everyone will be encouraged to participate.
4. No one may leave the camp grounds at any time.
5. No electronic items are allowed (cell phones, MP3/DVD/CD players, TV, tablets, radios, games, etc.). **Cell phones will be collected at the beginning of the conference and returned on Lord's Day morning. Please bring your printed Bible and hymn book to the meetings.**
6. No novels or magazines are permitted, only spiritual reading materials or homework. This includes the rides to and from the camp. Homework material may **not** include novels or other types of fiction.
7. Brothers are not permitted in the areas of the sisters' lodging, and sisters are not permitted in the areas the brothers are occupying.
8. All clothing worn during the entire weekend must be proper and modest. **No sleeveless, low cut, skin-tight or skin-revealing shirts may be worn. No shorts, pants that sag, hip-hugger or low rise pants may be worn. No clothing, caps, or shirts with improper pictures, logos, or symbols may be worn. This applies to brothers and sisters.** [Please read: Watchman Nee, *Messages for Building Up New Believers*, vol. 3, chapter 37].
9. All **Camp Regulations** must be observed. For example, no alcohol, tobacco, fireworks, firearms, knives, illegal drugs, flammable liquids, explosives, poisonous substances, or cliff climbing are permitted at the camp. *Fighting* – All forms of physical violence are expressly forbidden and are grounds for immediate expulsion of the offending parties and possible criminal charges being filed. *Profanity / Vulgar Speech* – will not be tolerated at any time.
10. Snacks and food are not allowed in the bedrooms.
11. Due to fire danger, candle usage will not be allowed in any building.
12. **All attendees must follow the instructions of the serving ones.**

Message One

The Man-Savior's Incarnation

Gen. 1:26-27 And God said, Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of heaven and over the cattle and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth. **27** And God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

Eph. 1:9 Making known to us the mystery of His will according to His good pleasure, which He purposed in Himself.

2 Cor. 4:4m ...the illumination of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God....

1 John 4:8 He who does not love has not known God, because God is love.

1 John 1:5 And this is the message which we have heard from Him and announce to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.

Rom. 3:21-22 But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been manifested, witness being borne to it by the Law and the Prophets; **22** Even the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ to all those who believe, for there is no distinction.

Heb. 12:10 For they disciplined for a few days as it seemed good to them; but He, for what is profitable that we might partake of His holiness.

Luke 1:75 In holiness and righteousness before Him all our days.

Luke 1:30-32 And the angel said to her, Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace with God. **31** And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus. **32** He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to Him the throne of David His father.

Message Two

The Man-Savior's Human Living

Luke 2:7 And she bore her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in swaddling clothes and laid Him in a manger because there was no place for them in the inn.

Luke 2:12 And this will be the sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a manger.

Luke 2:21–24 And when eight days were fulfilled to circumcise Him, His name was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb. **22** And when the days for their purification according to the law of Moses were fulfilled, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord **23** (Even as it is written in the law of the Lord, “Every male who opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord”), **24** And to give a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord: A pair of turtledoves or two young doves.

Luke 2:40 And the little child grew and became strong, being filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon Him.

Luke 2:41 And His parents went year by year to Jerusalem at the Feast of the Passover.

Luke 2:42–43 And when He became twelve years old, they went up according to the custom of the feast. **43** And when they had completed the days, while they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, and His parents did not know it.

Luke 2:49 And He said to them, Why is it that you were seeking Me? Did you not know that I must be in the things of My Father?

Luke 2:51 And He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was subject to them. And His mother carefully kept all these things in her heart.

Luke 2:52 And Jesus advanced in wisdom and stature and in the grace manifested in Him before God and men.

Luke 4:1 And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, while being tempted for forty days by the devil.

Luke 4:8 And Jesus answered and said to him, It is written, “You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only shall you serve.”

Luke 4:13 And when the devil had concluded every temptation, he went away from Him until an opportune time.

Isaiah 7:14–15 Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin will conceive and will bear a son, and she will call his name Immanuel. **15** He will eat curds and honey until he knows how to refuse evil and choose good.

Message Three

The Man-Savior's Standard of Morality

Gen. 1:26a And God said, Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; and let them have dominion....

Gen. 2:8–9 And Jehovah God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there He put the man whom He had formed. **9** And out of the ground Jehovah God caused to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, as well as the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Luke 10:33–34 But a certain Samaritan, who was journeying, came upon him; and when he saw him, he was moved with compassion; **34** And he came to him and bound up his wounds and poured oil and wine on them. And placing him on his own beast, he brought him to an inn and took care of him.

Luke 7:13–16 And when the Lord saw her, He was moved with compassion for her and said to her, Do not weep. **14** And He came near and touched the bier, and those carrying it stood still. And He said, Young man, to you I say, Arise. **15** And the dead man sat up and began to speak. And He gave him to his mother. **16** And fear took hold of all, and they glorified God, saying, A great prophet has been raised up among us, and, God has visited His people!

Luke 6:12 And in these days He went out to the mountain to pray, and He spent the whole night in prayer to God.

Luke 6:20 And He lifted up His eyes to His disciples and said, Blessed are the poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

Luke 6:27–29 But to you who hear I say, Love your enemies; do well to those who hate you; **28** Bless those who curse you; pray for those who revile you. **29** To him who beats you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from him who takes away your cloak, do not withhold your tunic either.

Luke 6:35–37 But love your enemies, and do good and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you

will be sons of the Most High; for He is kind to the unthankful and evil. **36** Be full of compassion, even as your Father also is full of compassion. **37** And do not judge, and you shall by no means be judged; and do not condemn, and you shall by no means be condemned; release, and you will be released.

Gal. 2:20a I am crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me...

Phil. 1:20-21a ...Christ will be magnified in my body... **21** For to me, to live is Christ...

Luke 6:47-49 Everyone who comes to Me and hears My words and does them, I will show you whom he is like. **48** He is like a man building a house, who dug and went deep and laid a foundation on the rock. And when a flood came, the river broke out against that house, yet it was not strong enough to shake it, because it had been built well. **49** But he who hears and does not do is like a man who built a house upon the earth without a foundation, against which the river broke out, and immediately it collapsed, and the crash of that house was great.

Message Four

The Man-Savior's Salvation

Col. 1:15 Who is the image of the invisible God, the Firstborn of all creation.

Heb. 1:3 Who, being the effulgence of His glory and the impress of His substance and upholding and bearing all things by the word of His power, having made purification of sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high.

Luke. 1:68-69 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, because He has visited and accomplished redemption for His people, **69** And raised a horn of salvation for us in the house of David His servant.

Phil. 4:8 Finally, brothers, what things are true, what things are dignified, what things are righteous, what things are pure, what things are lovely, what things are well spoken of, if there is any virtue and if any praise, take account of these things.

Luke 7:37-38 And behold, there was a woman in the city who was a sinner, and when she learned that He was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster flask of ointment. **38** And

she stood behind Him at His feet weeping and began to wet His feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head, and she kissed His feet affectionately and anointed them with the ointment.

Luke 7:48, 50 And He said to her, Your sins are forgiven....But He said to the woman, Your faith has saved you. Go in peace.

Luke 8:41–48 And behold, a man came whose name was Jairus, and this man was a ruler of the synagogue. And he fell at Jesus' feet and entreated Him to enter into his house, **42** Because he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. And as He went, the crowds pressed against Him. **43** And a woman who had a flow of blood for twelve years and who had spent all her livelihood on physicians and yet could not be healed by anyone, **44** Approached Him from behind and touched the fringe of His garment, and instantly her flow of blood stopped. **45** And Jesus said, Who is the one who touched Me? And when all denied it, Peter said, Master, the crowds are pressing and crushing You. **46** But Jesus said, Someone touched Me, for I perceived that power had gone out from Me. **47** And when the woman saw that she had not escaped notice, she came trembling and fell down before Him and declared before all the people the reason why she had touched Him and how she had been instantly healed. **48** And He said to her, Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace.

Luke. 19:8–10 And Zaccheus stood and said to the Lord, Behold, the half of my possessions, Lord, I give to the poor, and if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore four times as much. **9** And Jesus said to him, Today salvation has come to this house, because he also is a son of Abraham. **10** For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which is lost.

John 1:29 The next day he saw Jesus coming to him and said, Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!

2 Cor. 5:21 Him who did not know sin He made sin on our behalf that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

1 Pet. 2:24 Who Himself bore up our sins in His body on the tree, in order that we, having died to sins, might live to righteousness; by whose bruise you were healed.

Luke 23:4 And Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds, I find no fault in this man.

Luke 23:10–11 And the chief priests and the scribes stood by, vehemently accusing Him. **11** And Herod with his soldiers, having

despised Him and mocked Him, threw around Him splendid clothing and sent Him back to Pilate.

Luke 23:21–25 But they continued to shout, saying, Crucify, crucify Him! **22** But he said to them a third time, Why, what evil has this man done? I have found no cause of death in Him; I will therefore discipline Him and release Him. **23** But they pressed him with loud voices, asking that He be crucified, and their voices prevailed. **24** And Pilate gave sentence that their request be carried out, **25** And he released him who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, whom they asked for; but Jesus he delivered up to their will.

Luke 23:32–37 And two others also, who were criminals, were led with Him to be executed. **33** And when they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left. **34** And Jesus said, Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing. And dividing His garments, they cast lots. **35** And the people stood by, looking on. And the rulers also sneered, saying, He saved others; let Him save Himself if this is the Christ of God, the Chosen One! **36** And the soldiers also mocked Him, coming to Him and offering Him vinegar, **37** And saying, If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!

Luke 23:39–43 And one of the criminals who were hanged there blasphemed Him, saying, Are You not the Christ? Save Yourself and us! **40** But the other, answering, rebuked him and said, Do you not even fear God, since you are in the same judgment? **41** And we justly, for we are receiving what we deserve for what we did, but this Man has done nothing amiss. **42** And he said, Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom. **43** And He said to him, Truly I say to you, Today you shall be with Me in Paradise.

Luke 23:44–46 And it was now about the sixth hour, and darkness fell over the whole land until the ninth hour, **45** The sun's light failing; and the veil of the temple was split down the middle. **46** And crying with a loud voice, Jesus said, Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit. And saying this, He expired.

Message Five

The Man-Savior's Reproduction

Luke 24:1–7 Now on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, bringing the spices which they had prepared.

2 And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb; 3 But when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 And while they stood perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling clothing. 5 And they became frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, and the men said to them, Why are you seeking the living One among the dead? 6 He is not here but has been raised. Remember how He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee, 7 Saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise up.

1 Cor. 15:45 So also it is written, “The first man, Adam, became a living soul”; the last Adam became a life-giving Spirit.

2 Cor. 3:17–18 And the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. 18 But we all with unveiled face, beholding and reflecting like a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, even as from the Lord Spirit.

Phil. 1:19 For I know that for me this will turn out to salvation through your petition and the bountiful supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ.

John 12:24 Truly, truly, I say to you, Unless the grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it abides alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

John 3:6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
